What is domestic violence?

Domestic violence is ongoing patterns of behavior used to gain and maintain power and control over a partner or former partner in an intimate relationship.

It impacts individuals from all backgrounds, regardless of gender, ethnicity, economic status, age, or nationality. Domestic violence can result in physical injury, psychological trauma, and in severe cases, even death.

10 RED FLAGS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- 1. Jealousy uses jealousy as a sign of love
- 2. Intimidation induces fear
- 3. **Domination** sets all the rules
- 4. **Fault Finding** passes judgment and constantly criticizes
- 5. **Possessive** treats partner like property
- 6. **Disrespect** has negative attitudes about women or other partners
- 7. Controlling makes all the decisions
- 8. **Entitled** believes they have the right to say or do whatever
- 9. **Hypocrite** has different standards and rights for self than others
- 10. **Isolation** keeps friends or family away

Our Free, Confidential Services

Advocacy for victims/survivors

Advocates provide support within the legal, medical, and social services systems and provide victims/survivors with emotional support, individual and group counseling, information and community referrals, and support for parenting in the context of domestic violence.

Safe, compassionate support groups

Support groups provide a foundation for healing and offer victims/survivors a place to understand that they are not alone.

24/7 Resource & Support Line

A toll-free phone line is available 24/7 to provide information or immediate crisis counseling to victims/survivors of domestic violence or their family and friends.
